When a word has a silent -e at the end, it usually loses this -e when we add $\frac{\text{ing}}{\text{ing}}$ but keeps it when we add $\frac{\text{ful}}{\text{ing}}$ or $\frac{\text{ly}}{\text{y}}$ . Before adding an -s to words that end in a consonant followed by -y, change the $\frac{\text{y}}{\text{y}}$ to $\frac{\text{ie}}{\text{ie}}$ .
Add -ing to these words.   make + -ing becomes making   move + -ing becomes moving   save + -ing becomes Saving   dance + -ing becomes dancing
Add -ful to these words.hope + -ful becomeshopefulhate + -ful becomeshatefuluse + -ful becomesusefuluse + -ful becomesusefultaste + -ful becomestasteful
Add an -s to these words. Change the -y only if you need to.fly + -s becomesfliescry + -s becomescriescarry + -s becomescarriesfry + -s becomesfriesfry + -s becomesfriesfry + -s becomesfriesfry + -s becomesfriesassembly + -s becomesassemblies
