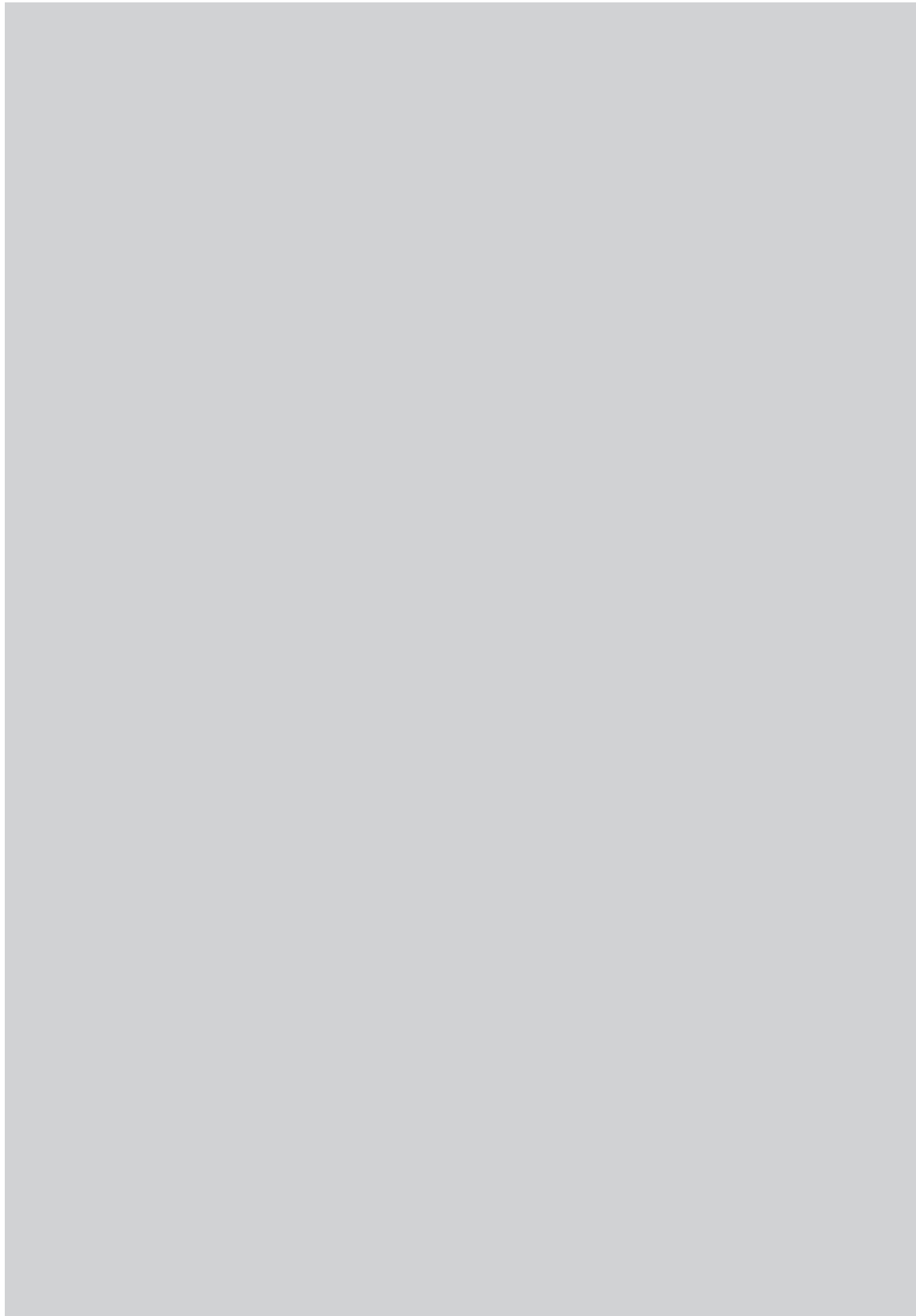
Remember: You don't need to use full sentences when writing **notes**.
